2:00 – 2:45 PM Breathing Gym for Your Band Nashville Room, Marriott
Presenter: Dr. Kevin Sanders, University of Memphis

Used by numerous schools, from elementary level to university, around the world, the Breathing Gym is a series of fun exercises that increase airflow and stamina, improve tone and breath control, reduce body tension, and raise energy level and focus. This session focuses on how and why the best drum corps, marching and concert bands implement the Breathing Gym to take their rehearsals and performances to the next level.

2:50 – 3:35 PM Fearless Performance: Top 10 Ways to Become Your Best Chattanooga Room, Marriott
Presenter: Dr. Jessie Thoman, University of Tennessee at Martin

Fearlessness is the art of being your best at any given moment. Come hear the Top 10 ways you can become your best. Whatever stage you perform on, whether it be a concert hall or a classroom, Jessie will share her Fearless Philosophies that can help everyone, through the art of excellent performance, reach their goals and dreams.

3:40 – 4:25 PM Demystifying Double Reeds: Strategies for the Oboe and Bassoon Sections of Your Bands Nashville Room, Marriott
Presenter: Dr. Douglas Owens, University of Tennessee at Martin

This session will empower band directors to foster the growth of and maintain a double reed section of excellence in their bands. Topics covered will include instrument selection and maintenance, the “who’s and “when’s of beginning students on bassoon and oboe (including ideas about students switching from other instruments), and issues pertaining to the selection and adjustment of reeds.

Conference participants will be presented with viable tools and techniques to better assess students of band, orchestra, and other musical ensembles. Both formative and summative types of assessments will be addressed.

This session is a culmination of 25 years of experience teaching beginning band and will focus on the essential concepts necessary to create a successful beginning band program. “Real life” examples of teaching / developing young musicians’ individual tone quality and intonation, thus improving balance and blend will be presented.

8:30 – 9:15 AM Session A: Finding That Sweet Sound: Tone Development for High School Trumpet Players Nashville Room, Marriott
Presenter: Dr. Kurt Gorman, University of Tennessee at Martin

I will discuss and emphasize the central concept of creating a beautiful sound, and address common problems with tone production and embouchure development. Related topics will include intonation, breathing, phrasing. A handout of exercises and examples will be distributed to attendees.

Session B: Healthy Set-Up for Cellists & Efficient Practice Techniques for the String Players’ Left Hand Chattanooga Room, Marriott
Presenters: Mr. Leonardo Altino, and Dr. Soh-Hyun Park Altino, University of Memphis

This practical session for string teachers will provide ways to build healthy bow hold and left hand for cello students. It will also explore simple and effective ways to help string students gain understanding of the left hand and the fingerboard in the area of intonation, shifting, and vibrato.

9:20 – 10:05 AM Fuel Tank, Fuel Line, Engine: Recommendations for a Tuba & Euphonium Tune-Up Chattanooga Room, Marriott
Presenter: Dr. Ed Owen, Arkansas State University

This informative session will provide music educators with tools to “tune-up” their beginner or advanced euphonium and tuba sections. Demonstrations of excellent and poor technique will be demonstrated and discussed with the express purpose of solving the most common problem areas. Topics will include the following fundamentals: Poster and Holding Positions; Breathing Technique; Embouchure Formation and Tone Production; Articulation; Vibrato; and Intonation.

10:10 – 10:55 AM In the Trenches: Who Plays What in Beginning Band Matters! Nashville Room, Marriott
Presenter: Dr. Nola Jones, University of Tennessee at Martin

This session is a lab setting with middle school students attempting to play musical instruments for the first time. The clinic focuses on identifying common denominators that indicate potential for success on each instrument and strategies for assisting beginning band students in choosing to play that instrument.

2:00 – 2:45 PM Tweets, Friends, and Walls: The Good, The Bad, and The Ugly of Social Media for Your Band Program Nashville Room, Marriott
Presenter: Dr. Michael Stewart, University of Tennessee Knoxville

Unlike previous generations, today’s students are constantly faced with new and immediate means of communication. The days of letters and phone calls have since been replaced with texts, chat rooms, and emails. Constant access to information can be a double-edged sword for band directors that can no longer be ignored. Social Media gives band directors the opportunity to build public relations, communicate with parents/students, provide information, and recruit. However, Social Media, if not monitored, can also be a source of many problems in these same areas. This presentation will discuss ways to utilize the full resources of today’s Social Media while protecting you, your students, and your program from the pitfalls of 24/7 communication.

3:00 – 3:45 PM Put Your Rehearsal Under the Microscope: A Method of Analysis to Streamline Your Rehearsal Technique Nashville Room, Marriott
Presenter: Dr. Albert Nguyen, University of Memphis

This clinic is designed to introduce the Scribe Software as a means of rehearsal analysis to give directors precise feedback to fine tune their teaching. More importantly, the session will highlight the commonalities in the rehearsal techniques of master teachers to provide another point of view for today’s music educator.

Born in Denver to a musical family, Shamie Royston, pianist, composer and educator is a unique musician in her own way. Most of her acclaim has been noted in her musical compositions as well as her exquisite ability to teach young musicians ranging from elementary school to the college level and she has been known to be one of the top educators in her field. She has given clinics and adjudicated many jazz festivals in the Denver area as well as taught jazz ensembles to young musicians.

Shamie studied classical piano at Denver University and was identified as a rising up-comer on the Denver music scene. She graduated from DU with honors and began teaching at Denver School for the Arts. For the next decade, Shamie produced top Jazz and Concert Band ensembles in Colorado public school systems, as well as citywide and state jazz ensembles. Her middle school band at Sierra Middle School, was one of the top in her district. Shamie also held one of four positions teaching in the prestigious Colorado Honor Band organization. During this time Shamie honed her writing and playing skills, and in 2006, she moved to New Jersey to pursue music.

Presently, Shamie is an up and coming pianist in the jazz arena. She has a soulful, melodic approach to playing the piano, and her compositions are appreciated by many jazz listeners. Shamie has written for trumpeter, Sean Jones, Sage, Tia Fuller and many other colleges and universities. She has performed with many great musicians such as, Sean Jones, Christian McBride, Lonnie Plaxico, Ron Miles, Tia Fuller, Ralph Peterson, Kit McClure Big Band, and many others. Shamie continues to be a leading force and new voice in the jazz world. Shamie's debut CD entitled **Portraits** was released in Fall 2011.

Reginald Thomas can be seen fronting his own groups (Mardra/Reggie Thomas Ensemble; OGD) on both piano and Hammond organ and as a sideman with great artists including, Ann Hampton Callaway, and the Carl Allen/Rodney Whitaker Ensemble. Most recently he was the accompanist for the Thelonious Monk International Jazz Vocal Competition at the Kennedy Center in Washington DC. Reggie continues to appear as guest artist at collegiate jazz festivals around the country including Lawrence University, the University of South Florida, and Texas Tech University. He has also performed internationally in Calgary, Alberta, Canada; Milan, Italy; Warsaw and Poznan, Poland; Senegal, West Africa; and London, England. Recordings include work with Clay Jenkins, Kim Richmond, Clark Terry/Mike Vax, as well as his own recordings *Fade to Blue* with wife Mardra (MaxJazz), *Standard Time* (Victoria) and *4* (Jazz Compass). Reggie has been awarded the Excellence in the Arts award from the Greater St. Louis Arts and Education Council and was named in the *Riverfront Times* 2005 "Best of St. Louis" issue as Best Jazz Artist.

After almost 20 years as professor of music at Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Professor Thomas joins the faculty of Michigan State University in the fall of 2011. Reggie is also a consultant/clinician for Jazz at Lincoln Center working with the Essentially Ellington Program and Band Director Academy and has served on several summer jazz faculties across the country and abroad including the International Association for Jazz Education Teacher Training Institute; the Birch Creek Music Center; the Eastman School of Music Summer Jazz Camp; Summer Jazz Academy in Chodziez, Poland and, most recently, the Barbican Center in London. He remains an active clinician/adjudicator at colleges throughout the country and at International Association for Jazz Education Conventions (now JEN). Thomas has directed All State Jazz Bands, Combos and Jazz Choirs in Illinois, Iowa, Kentucky, Maine, South Dakota and Tennessee and directed the first ever Missouri All-College Jazz Band.

Chamberlain was appointed the founding director of the Tucson Symphony Orchestra's newly formed professional chorus. In its first season, critics said of the TSOC that its Messiah was "sensational" and the Verdi Requiem was prepared "to exacting standards of perfection."

Dr. Chamberlain won the National Conducting Competition sponsored by the Association of Professional Vocal Ensembles in 1987 and in 1990 was selected from an international field of conductors as the only American to conduct on the final concert of the prestigious 21st Annual Oregon Bach Festival. He made his Carnegie Hall debut in May, 1995 conducting a world premiere with the Bohuslav Martinu Philharmonic.

An active member of ACDA, Chamberlain has held numerous elected and appointed positions including state presidencies of Iowa and Arizona, and North Central Division Youth and Student Activities R&S Chair. He has been a guest conductor/clinician nationally and internationally.

A graduate of the Indiana University School of Music with BME, MM and DMus degrees, Chamberlain studied conducting with Julius Herford, Margaret Hillis and John Nelson, piano with Menachem Pressler, Wallace Hornbrook and Nicholas Zumbro, and has continued choral/orchestral conducting studies with Helmut Rilling, Andrew Davis, Dale Warland and Robert Page.

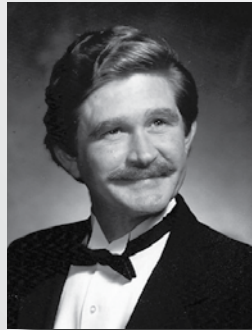

DONALD ANTHONY



Dr. Donald Anthony served as Director of Bands at the University of Tennessee at Martin from 1979 to 2001. Originally from Humboldt, Tennessee, he attended the University of Mississippi and was named the "Outstanding Music Student" at Ole Miss in 1969. He went on to become a two-time graduate of the University of Mississippi and earn his doctorate in music education in 1981 from the University of Southern Mississippi.

Dr. Anthony's passion for teaching students was evident early in his career. He taught elementary beginners in Oxford for several years while still an undergraduate. Before joining UT Martin, Anthony was the Director of Bands at Greenwood High School in Greenwood, MS for ten years. He also served as conductor of the USA Band for the Bicentennial Tour of Europe in 1976, as well as conductor of the USA School Band and Chorus on tours of Europe in 1972, Canada in 1973, and Hawaii in 1974 and 1975.

Perhaps Dr. Anthony will be best remembered by West Tennessee band students for creating the UT Martin Honor Band in 1979 and founding the UT Martin Concert Festival. He also served as coordinator and host for the annual Solo and Ensemble Contest at UT Martin.

Dr. Anthony served as assistant chair of the Department of Fine and Performing Arts from 1982 to 1985; acted as a West Tennessee Band and Orchestra Association representative; served on the Tennessee Music Educators Association Board for more than 20 years; and was a member of the Governor's School Board for the School of Fine and Performing Arts.

As a member of the national professional music fraternity Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Dr. Anthony served as sponsor for the UT Martin chapter of Sinfonians. He was a member of the Music Educators National Conference, the American School Band Director's Association, and the College Band Directors National Association.

Dr. Anthony is survived by his wife, Mrs. Tina (Anthony) Cantrell, and his daughter, Dr. Sarah (Anthony) Petersen. His legacy continues in his many former students who have become band directors and music educators throughout the region.

A. E. McCLAIN



A. E. McClain developed a love of music early in life and played in dance bands to augment his income during the depression. He devoted most of his adult life to music education in the Memphis and Shelby County school systems. Though he majored in Latin in college, "Mr. Mac" was mostly known for his accomplishments as a band director.

The premier bands he developed were at Nicholas Blackwell High School in Bartlett and at Central High School in Memphis from 1940 until 1960. Both progressed into outstanding musical organizations and consistently won superior ratings at regional and state festivals. Including on occasions, the coveted outstanding concert band award. The Central Band also participated in the Tri-State Music Festival in Oklahoma for several years and was named the outstanding concert band there in 1960.

He was a demanding leader who would not hesitate to dismiss a member who failed to "get with the program". At the same time he had a genuine affection for his "kids" which allowed for a strong bonding with them that was very evident in the rapport he had with them. His real talent and skill was inspiring and motivating young teenagers. That ability is consistently mentioned in the memories of his former students, including the following: "(He) was a great role model and mentor. He was exacting as a musician and director, who taught a sense of perfectionism in music; he also gave life-changing lessons in character and ethics to those of us who were lucky enough to be in his band."

Upon retirement, he continued to be very active as an adjudicator and facilitator at various band competitions and activities right up until his death. He died of heart failure in 1979 while serving as a judge at a Mississippi high school band festival. The annual award for the Outstanding Young Band Director in Mississippi is named in his honor.

Mr. Mac was the first inductee to the Memphis State University Bandmasters Hall of Fame in 1977, and in 2010, he was inducted into the Tennessee Bandmasters Association Hall of Fame.

TONY BURRISS

Tony Burriss retired from teaching in 2007 after 30 years as a band director. He started his career in the Decatur County Tennessee School District teaching elementary, junior high, and high school band. In 1979, he moved to Union City, Tennessee, to take a job with the King Music Company and helped to start band programs in Rutherford, Greenfield, and Dresden, Tennessee. The following year he became band director at the newly opened Gibson County High School and where he remained for 11 years. In 1991, he became the band director at Peabody High School in Trenton, Tennessee, and spent the last 16 years of his career teaching band and music history. While at Peabody, the band won three State Division I Marching Band Championships.

Tony served as president of the West Tennessee School Band and Orchestra Association and also on the board of the Tennessee Music Educators Association. While serving as president of WTSBOA, he, along with David Wood, were the first to secure the Memphis Convention Center and the Cannon Center for the Fine Arts as the yearly venue for the All West events.

Tony grew up in Morrow, Ohio, just outside of Cincinnati. His high school band director was R. Kent Hollimbach who studied composition with Nadia Boulanger in Paris, France. After high school he entered University of Tennessee - Martin and studied Music Education and percussion with Nancy Mathesen. He attributes his love of music to these two very special people.

Tony is currently serving in his second term as Mayor of City of Trenton, Tennessee, and he is an Elder and choir director at the First Presbyterian Church in Trenton. He has been married to his wife Kathi for 36 years and has two children, Emily and Ryan, and four grandchildren: Kizer, Katibeth, Andrew, and Kannon.

He currently is the conductor of the Gibson County Community Band, plays drums for the blues group, The Blueberry Jam Band, and serves as a judge and adjudicator in the southeast region. Many of Tony's students have gone on to become band directors and music education teachers, including his daughter who is the middle school band director at Medina Middle School in Medina, Tennessee.



MARION A. REITHEL



Marion Reithel was born and reared in Rose Claire, Illinois. He began his music career at an early age playing in the town band, alongside his father. In 1954 he graduated from Murray State University with a degree in Music Education and immediately took his one and only job as a music educator in the Union City School System.

He became director of the Junior High and High School Bands at Union City in the fall of 1954 and never left. He taught in the Union City System for 44 years...a remarkable feat in the world of music education.

During his long tenure at Union City, Marion became active in all aspects of the community. He started the Union City Civic Chorus, a Dixieland band, and the Instant Replay Big Band that remained together for over 20 years. Marion was also active as the choir director at a number of churches over the years.

His greatest accomplishment as a music educator would have to be his love for his students and his love for music education. In his 44 years at Union City Marion made band the "thing to do." He consistently maintained over 30 percent of the student body in the band program.

One of his former students and the current Director of Bands at Union City John Easley said, "Marion thought it was always the most important aspect to involve as many students as possible in the band program. When I came home to be his assistant, the one thing that he said was 'not all kids are going to be professionals in music, but they can all be advocates.'"

Because of Reithel's philosophy, the Union City Band Program still maintains 30 to 35 percent of the student body in the program today, and many local band supporters themselves are former students of the man the town calls "Union City's Mr. Music."

CHARLES F. CLARK



Charles F. Clark received his early music education in the public schools of Tennessee. Born in Brownsville, he played clarinet in elementary school and continued this activity through high school. When his family moved to Memphis just before his senior year, he played in the Central High School Band and came under the tutelage of A. E. McClain. Attending college at The University of Louisiana at Monroe, he played in the band under Dr. Joe Barry Mullins. Also during college he took up the viola, which became his primary instrument for the remainder of his career.

As a teacher of band, Clark held positions in Natchez, MS, Jefferson County, KY, Jefferson City, TN, and Memphis. In 1971, he became a teacher in the brand new orchestra program of the Memphis City Schools, and helped grow that program through the years. He retired from his position at Overton High School for the Performing Arts in 1991.

Not content to sit idle in retirement, Clark conducted the orchestra at Rhodes College and continued conducting a decade of musicals at Theatre Memphis. He was also interim choir director at Evergreen Presbyterian Church.

As a performer, Clark played in orchestras in Louisville, KY, and Ocala, FL, as well as several Tennessee groups: Knoxville, Jackson, and Germantown.

Clark served as Secretary-Treasurer of the West TN School Band and Orchestra Assn. from 1967 to 1999, with one short break in the interim. He served for several years on the Board of Directors of the TN Music Educators Assn., and for six years as Secretary of the National School Orchestra Assn. He also chaired the All-State Convention in Memphis. In addition to his membership in music education organizations, he is a member of Phi Mu Alpha

Sinfonia, Omicron Delta Kappa, and Pi Kappa Lambda music honor society.

Clark currently resides in Darien, GA.

ART THEIL



Art Theil was born in Sandusky, Ohio, on August 31, 1931. Upon entering 7th grade, he began to play the clarinet. During his junior year in high school he was appointed drum major of the high school band. In the fall of 1949 he entered Capital University in Ohio. He became a member and officer of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Music Fraternity. While there, he met Mary Lou Snively, "...the finest clarinetist on campus, and a very pretty and talented coed." They were married in 1953.

Art's first teaching assignment was as the band director at Malvern High School in Ohio. After a short 2 months, he was drafted into the U. S. Army. He was able to return to his job after two years at Fort Sill. Following Malvern High School, Art taught at Sandy Valley High School, Carrollton High School, and Fremont High School in Ohio. Receiving numerous state and national accolades and awards. Art also received his Master's Degree from Vandercook College of Music in Chicago.

After Fremont, Mr. Theil became the band director at Florence State College, now The University of North Alabama. After 4 years, Art was hired as the Assistant Band Director and Saxophone Instructor at then Memphis State College. In 1974, Art was appointed Director of Bands and two years later was promoted to Associate Professor. In addition to duties with the Marching Band, Wind Ensemble, and Concert Band, Art was director of one of 4 nationally recognized jazz bands. The Marching band performed at The Superdome, Astrodome, and the Rose Bowl. The Wind Ensemble toured throughout the country.

In 1987, Art and Mary Lou retired to North Port, FL. Not wanting to be "totally" retired, they joined several community bands, and Art continued to play in many dance bands in the area. Mr. Theil was also involved in writing half-time shows for Sarasota Riverview High School Marching Band and serving as an adjunct teacher there for several years. He also served as choir director at several area church choir.

Dr. Timothy W. Oliver is the Director of Bands and Coordinator of Wind and Percussion Studies at Arkansas State University. A strong proponent of both performance and music education, Dr. Oliver conducts the ASU Wind Ensemble, teaches courses in graduate and undergraduate conducting and music education, and supervises student teachers. A native of Centralia, MO, Dr. Oliver is a graduate of Truman State University in Kirksville, MO, from which he holds the degrees of Bachelor of Arts in Music, Master of Arts in Music with an emphasis in conducting, and Master of Arts in Education. He earned his Doctor of Philosophy in Music Education Degree from the Florida State University in Tallahassee, FL. Some of Dr. Oliver's teachers include Daniel Peterson, Thomas Trimborn, Clifford Madsen, and James Croft. Prior to his appointment at ASU, Dr. Oliver was a faculty member at the University of Kansas and at Temple University. He also previously served as both a high school and junior high school band director in Missouri and Florida.

Dr. Oliver is an active guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator for a diverse array of musicians at the professional, collegiate and secondary school levels. He is also an active researcher with projects focusing on music performance and music education. Dr. Oliver has conducted ensembles or presented research in 17 different states and the District of Columbia. Publications featuring his research include the Journal of Band Research, Journal of Historical Research in Music Education, Teaching Music and The Instrumentalist.

Dr. Oliver is a member of the College Band Directors National Association, World Association for Symphonic Bands and Ensembles, National Band Association, Music Educators National Conference, Arkansas School Band and Orchestra Association, Arkansas Music Educators Association, Phi Kappa Lambda and an honorary member of Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma. He enjoys a variety of activities including racquetball, reading and completing home improvement projects as well as spending time with his wife Rebecca and children Benjamin and Gwendolyn.



Dr. Lewis Liddell, Sr. is Associate Professor of Music and Director Bands at Jackson State University. He received the Bachelor of Music Education degree from Jackson State University, Master of Music Education degree from the University of Louisiana Monroe, and the Doctorate from Mississippi State University. He studied conducting under Professor William W. Davis, the internationally renowned conductor, Dr. Joe Barry Mullins, and marching band techniques under Dr. William C. Moffit.

In addition to directing the Jackson State University Marching Band and conducting the Symphonic Band, he supervises a staff of six directors and is responsible for the administration of the total band program. As a member of the undergraduate and graduate faculty, his teaching duties include directing Master Theses/research projects, applied clarinet, oboe, bassoon, wind literature, marching band techniques, music appreciation, and conducting.

His teaching career began in 1967, as band director at Wesley Ray High School, Angie, Louisiana. In 1970, Dr. Liddell assumed the band director's position at Brinkley High School, Jackson, Mississippi. After 14 years of teaching and directing bands in Jackson Public Schools, Dr. Liddell moved to higher education, serving as Director of Bands at Jackson State University since July 1992.

Dr. Liddell has served as an adjudicator, consultant, clinician, speaker and conductor throughout the nation. Dr. Liddell has received numerous honors and awards including the "Ambassadors of SWAC" Award, Jackson Music Award, and the Jackson State University National Alumni Association's Achievement Award. Recently, he was inducted into the Mississippi Magnolia Band Director's Hall of Fame. His affiliations include the Music Educators National Conference (MENC), the College Band Directors National Association (CBDNA), Phi Delta Kappa, Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society, and Kappa Kappa Psi Band Fraternity.

Dr. Liddell is married to Dr. L. Frances P. Liddell. They are the parents of four sons and two daughters. And five of their children are graduates of Jackson State University.

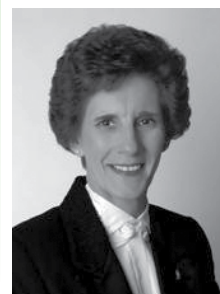
Paula Crider is Past President of the National Band Association. She has been a member of NBA since 1969. Following a distinguished thirty-three year teaching career, Professor Crider continues to work with young musicians, and has served as guest conductor, lecturer and adjudicator in twenty-nine states, Canada, Ireland, the United Kingdom, and Australia.

Prior to her seventeen years of service on the faculty of the University of Texas, Dr. Crider enjoyed 16 years of public school teaching. She has taught at all levels, and holds the distinction of having been the first female in the State of Texas to serve as Director of Bands at a class 5-A high school.

Her Crockett High School Bands in Austin, Texas earned numerous awards and honors, performed for national conventions, and were twice named Texas State Class 5A Marching Band Champions. Her band's performance at the Second Biennial NBA Convention in Knoxville, Tennessee remains a most memorable event in her musical career.

Professor Crider retired from The University of Texas in 1999 where she served as director of the renown University of Texas Longhorn Band. While at the university she taught conducting, brass techniques, and marching band methods; supervised student teachers; and conducted the Symphony Band.

Honors and awards include the "Eyes of Texas" awards for teaching excellence, the Tau Beta Sigma/Kappa Kappa Psi "Outstanding Service to Music" award, the Sudler "Legion of Merit," and the Texas Bandmaster's "Meritorious Achievement" Award. She is a member of the prestigious American Bandmaster's Association, and is the third woman to have been so honored.

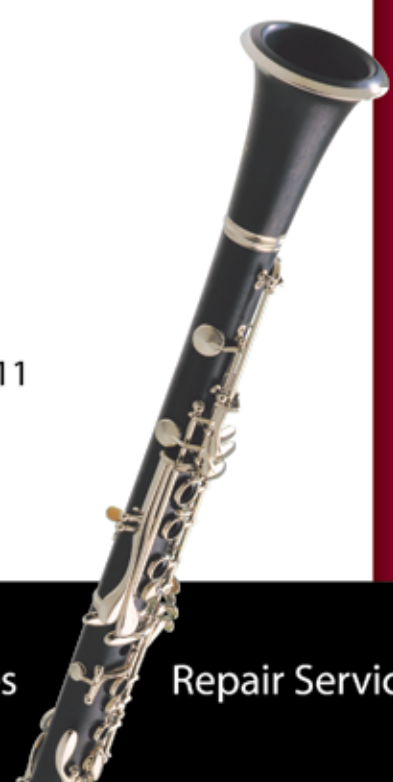
