





By the age of 12, Tanya Darby was already expressing the elements of a mature jazz player and anually performed at the Monterey Jazz Festival. Tanya received her Bachelor's degree in Jazz Performance from the Manhattan School of Music where she received various awards including the Jon Faddis Award in Musical Excellence for Most Promising Jazz Trumpet Talent of the Year. She gained notoriety for her soulful style and began freelancing throughout the New York metropolitan area and the world.

Tanya is a current member of the Vanguard Jazz Orchestra, The Roy Hargrove Big Band, The DIVA Jazz Orchestra, and Jimmy Heath's Queens Jazz Orchestra. She has performed and toured with artists and ensembles including Clark Terry, Jon Faddis, Paquito D'Riviera, Gladys Knight, Frank Foster, Bill Cosby, Michel Camilo, Slide Hampton, Dianne Reeves, The Count Basie Orchestra, The Duke Ellington Orchestra, The Mingus Band, George Gruntz, Rufus Reid, and the Cab Calloway Orchestra. She has appeared on the television show "BET on Jazz" as part of the T.S. Monk Sextet and performed with Aretha Franklin as part of the Arista Records Twenty-Five Year Anniversary Special on NBC.

Tanya regularly performs clinics, master classes, and workshops internationally. She is currently an adjunct professor of trumpet at Temple University and an instructor and supervisor for the New York Pops Salute to Music, Create a Symphony, and Rhythm Rhyme and Rap education programs.

Tanya can be heard on numerous recordings including Grammy award winning artists Amy Winehouse and Joss Stone. Recordings also include Grammy nominated recording artists: Vanguard Jazz Orchestra, Bobby Sanabria, and DIVA. Tanya also recorded the soundtracks for Showtime's original series The L Word, Ann Hampton Calloway Blues in the Night, Anat Cohen Noir, Maurice Hines To Nat King Cole with Love, and various commercial studio works.

Rodney Whitaker is one of the world's renowned double bass performers, educators, mentors and is dedicated to inspiring and growing the next generation of jazz educators and musicians. A Detroit native, he grew up in the city soaking in the sounds of jazz and classical music and working with the finest musicians in the city. Building on his Detroit roots and enormous talent,

Whitaker went on to earn an international reputation as one of the world's finest jazz double bass performers. He completed a seven-year tenure as bassist with the Wynton Marsalis' Sextet, the

Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra and has toured the world over the last twenty-six years, collaborating with over 100+ legendary performing jazz artists such as

Dianne Reeves, Hank Jones, Mulgrew Miller, Junko Onishi, Yutaka Shiina, Kenny Burrell, Diana Krall, John Lewis, Kathleen Battle, Marian McPartland,

Wycliffe Gordon, Kenny Garrett, Bradford Marsalis, Bob James, Roy Hargrove, Jon Carl Hendricks, Tommy Flanagan, Frank

Morgan, Terence Blanchard, Betty "Be-Bop" Carter, Chick Corea, and leading symphony orchestras across the world—just to name a few. In addition, he has appeared and presented master classes at the International Association of Jazz Educators (IAJE) conferences. Featured on more than 100+ recordings - from film to compact discs - Whitaker's film scores, China, directed by Jeff Wray, was released on PBS Fall 2002 and Malaria and Malawi, released on PBS Fall 2010. Also, Whitaker has a DVD release featuring Michigan State University's Jazz Department entitled, "Inside Jazz" and three new compact discs entitled, "Get Ready" & "Work To Do"—both on Mack Avenue Records and "Better Than Alright" by Michigan State University College of Music. In 2011, he was nominated for an EMMY for the 'Original Music' category, "Malawi and Malaria: Fighting to Save the Children" produced by Robert Gould and Sue Carter. Whitaker collaborated with musicians Phil Dwyer and Alan Jones on "Let Me Tell You About My Day," produced by Alma Records and was nominated for a Juno Award in 2006 for Traditional Jazz Album of the Year, Canada's equivalent to the United State of America's Grammy. He is a full professor of jazz double bass and director of jazz studies at Michigan State University where he has built one of the leading jazz degree granting programs offering both a bachelor's and master's degrees in Jazz Performance.

CHESTER MCKINNEY

Chester McKinney was born June 7, 1943 in Whiteville, Tennessee. He is the 10th out of 11 children born to Henry and Emma McKinney. Soon after his birth, his family moved to Jackson.

Chester was educated in the Jackson public schools and developed an interest in music at an early age. He played the trumpet in Merry High School band and after high school he studied other brass instruments. Mr. McKinney attended Tennessee A & I State University in Nashville where he majored in Music Education. He graduated with a B.S in Music Education in 1965 and in 1972 received his Masters degree in Music Education.

Mr. McKinney has 42 years of teaching experience. He taught band for 3 years at Rosenwald High School in Trenton, 5 years in Camden, New Jersey, 27 years in Jackson Public Schools, 1 year part time at Caywood Middle in Lexington,

and 6 years part time at Bemis Intermediate School in Jackson.

Mr. McKinney is now retired, working in his church and playing trombone in a local Jazz/R&B band in Jackson, Tennessee.

JAMES GODSEY

James Monroe Godsey was born in Richie, Maryland on January 12, 1935 and was raised in Haleyville, Alabama. He graduated high school in Florence, Alabama and attended Murray State College where he received a Bachelor of Music Education and later a Masters of Music Education.

In 1955 he married Nancy Joan Reaves. They made their home in Dyersburg, Tennessee where he was the band director for 28 years. In 1983, the Dyersburg High School Band was awarded the Grand National Championship at the Northeast Mississippi Jr. College contest in Booneville, MS. While in Dyersburg, he taught in the choral department at Dyersburg State Community College for a number of years. He was the organist and choir director at the First Presbyterian Church and was the choral teacher at Dyersburg High School. Mr. Godsey was the founder of the Dyersburg Little Theatre, which endured a 21 year span of musicals for the community. Jim was the creator of the Dyersburg High School Marching band Contest which 38 years later is known as the Annual Jim Godsey Symphony of Sound Marching Band Contest.

In 1986, he went to Obion County High School where he was the band director for 6 more years. During this time, his bands won countless honors and traveled all over the country. Obion Central High School Band went to claim the Single A State Championship in 1992, which is among his highest honors.

Jim Godsey died in 1993 at the age of 58 after a battle with cancer. He taught up to 6 weeks prior to his death with his wishes fulfilled of finishing the last band camp he would attend in August 1993.

He was a husband of Nancy Godsey and father of Debbie Godsey Randolph and Millette Godsey Gathright. He is a grandfather of 5 grandchildren and a great-grandfather of 3 boys with 2 more boys on the way in June.

KARLA PHILIPP

Karla Philipp holds the B.M. in Music Education from the University of Arizona, and the M.M. in Double Bass performance from Memphis State University (now the University of Memphis). An active performer, she has performed with the Tucson Symphony, the Arizona Light Opera, the Memphis Symphony, the Tupelo Symphony and is currently in the Jackson, TN Symphony. In addition, she is a freelance performer in the Memphis area.



Ms. Philipp is a 1998 recipient of the Rotary Award for Teacher Excellence. She is also a three time recipient of the Outstanding Teacher Award from the Governor's School for the Arts. Karla has had the privilege of doing clinics, summer music camps and workshops around the country including the American Suzuki Institute in Stevens Point Wisconsin, and the Intermountain Suzuki String Institute in Salt Lake City, Utah.

GREG STOVER

Greg Stover is an accomplished musician and teacher who began his career in music in 1961 in the public schools of Memphis, TN. He was a member of the Georgian Hill Junior High and Frayser High School Bands. At the age of 15, Greg began performing in numerous garage and club bands in the Memphis and Arkansas areas. By his senior year, Greg was serving as Director of the ROTC Band and was selected as the official drummer for the Memphis Cotton Carnival Royalty.

After high school, Greg entered Union University where he studied music under the direction of Dr. Gerald Welker and Mr. Charles Huffman. At Union, Greg performed in both the stage and symphonic bands and was an active member of Phi Mu Alpha and the Lambda Chi Alpha fraternities. He earned his Bachelor of Music degree with a major in Percussion Performance in 1972.

While attending Union University, Greg had the opportunity to perform in backup capacity with many well-known performers including Gary Collins, Mary Ann Mobley, Rosey Greer, and Phyllis George.
