

Originally from Memphis, Tennessee, trumpeter, composer and arranger *Bill Mobley* moved to New York City in 1987 and has since become a fixture in the city's flourishing jazz scene. His sideman credits include New York performances with James Williams, Geoff Keezer, Mingus Dynasty Band, the Maria Schneider Orchestra, and the Toshiko Akiyoshi Orchestra, the Pete McGuinness Jazz Orchestra, the NuYorkestra, and CTA to name a few, as well as smaller groups led by Marvin "Smitty" Smith, George Coleman, and T. S. Monk among others. He has recorded 3 big band CDs as leader and arranger in New York for Spacetime Records as well as 4 other small group records for Spacetime as leader. For 3 and 1/2 years he was director of the Smoke Big Band on Monday nights at Smoke Jazz Club in Manhattan where his latest big band CD was recorded live by Spacetime. Numerous other recordings as sideman are in Bill's credits, which include CDs by Geoff Keezer (2), Alan Dawson, Bill Pierce, James Williams, Bill Easley, Jean Toussaint, Gary Morgan and Panamericana, Public Enemy, Little Maestros, Harold Mabern, Donald Brown (4), Pete McGuinness Jazz Orchestra(2), Mike Kaplan nonet, Chuck Braman Quintet, and B.D. Lenz. Bill has taught in the Music Dept.of William Paterson U. in New Jersey for the last eight years where he has students in Ear Training, Ensembles, and Private lessons.

Rodney Jordan is a native of Memphis, Tennessee where he grew up playing the bass in church and with his Westwood High School Orchestra. He later studied music with Dr. London Branch, Alvin Fielder, and Andy Hardwick at Jackson State University in Jackson, Mississippi. In his college years, Jordan joined the Mississippi Symphony Orchestra where he served as Assistant Principal Bassist. After graduating, he became Chair of the String Department at the Dougherty County Public

School System and served as Principal Bassist with the Albany Symphony Orchestra in Albany, GA. Teaching has always been an important part of Mr. Jordan's life and career. In addition to teaching strings in Dougherty County, he also taught in the DeKalb County School Systems in Atlanta, Georgia, Darton College (part of the University System of Georgia) in Albany and at Georgia State University in Atlanta. While living in Atlanta, Jordan became one of the city's most active jazz bassists, performing and recording with some of America's finest jazz musicians, including Marcus Printup, Mulgrew Miller, James Williams, Milt Jackson, George Coleman, and Russell Gunn. He joined the faculty in the School of Music at Florida State University in Tallahassee, FL in 2001 where he now holds a rank of Associate Professor of Jazz Studies. Jordan teaches jazz bass, jazz combo playing, music education classes, and jazz styles and analysis.

Recent performances include: Wigmore Hall with the Marcus Roberts trio in London, England; The Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts with Rene Marie in Washington DC and The Monterey Jazz Festival with the Scotty Barnhart Band in Monterey, California.

Recent recordings include: Across the Imaginary Divide with Bela Fleck and the Marcus Roberts Trio-Pivot-Melvin Jones/Turnaround Records 2011, Celebrating Christmas- The Marcus Roberts Trio/2011, Higher Ground with the Marcus Roberts Trio-Live from Lincoln Center 2005; Black lace Freudian Slip, Voice of My Beautiful Country-Moterna Records 2011, Experiment in Truth- Independent Release 2007 with Rene Marie; Say It Plain with Scotty Barnhart- Unity Music 2009; Keep it Simple with Curtis Fuller - High Note Records 2005; When Cooler Heads Prevail with Bill Anschell - Summit Records 2002 and Ethnomusicology Volume 1 with Russell Gunn - Atlantic Records 1999 which received a Grammy nomination for best contemporary jazz recording in 2000.

Sarah Angeles conducts the Philharmonic Orchestra at Dorman High School and teaches strings at Anderson Mill Elementary, and Jesse Bobo Elementary. In addition to her duties she travels to all of the middle schools in the district to assist and work with students. She joined the District Six faculty in 2011. Previous to working in Spartanburg, Ms. Angeles worked nine years at the High school and Middle School level in Las Vegas, Nevada. In addition to her public school teaching in Las Vegas, Ms. Angeles taught the String Methods class at the University of Las Vegas and directed one of the Las Vegas Youth Orchestras for five years. After having her first son Jacob Dean she moved to Columbia, SC where she taught at a brand new middle school building the string program from a part time position to a full time position in four years.

Ms. Angeles earned her Bachelor's Degree in music education from Loyola University in New Orleans under the mentorship of her father, Professor Dean Angeles, a nationally recognized music educator and all-state conductor. She earned her Master's Degree in applied performance from the University of Las Vegas. Her professional affiliations include the National Association for Music Educators as well as the South Carolina Music Educators Association. She has done several clinics in the South Carolina area for fellow colleagues. She conducted the 2015 Charleston Region Orchestra and has been a concert festival judge for the Midlands Area. As well as doing clinics, Ms Angeles has done summer time work both abroad and in the states. For three years she assisted her father Dean Angeles with the Belgium Music and Sports Camp. She taught five summers for the Columbia, SC Tri-District Arts Camp. She taught one summer for the Madison, WI summer camp. This past summer 2016 she and her father presented their string methods clinic down in Brazil for an International Music Education Conference.

She played professionally for two years with the Las Vegas Philharmonic and currently plays with civic ensembles in Asheville, NC. Throughout the summers Ms Angeles continues her higher education, attends conducting/string workshops, and helps direct the district summer camps in the Spartanburg area.

In her personal time she and her husband enjoy raising their two young sons, Jacob Dean and Maxwell Morton

Dr. D'Alimonte earned a Master of Music in horn performance from Ithaca College and holds a Doctorate of Musical Arts in orchestral conducting from the Eastman School of Music, in Rochester, NY, where she studied with Israeli conductor, Maestro Mendi Rodan. Eastman honored her with its prestigious Evan Whallon conducting award.

Jeffrey Huddleston, a noted musician, composer, arranger, performer, clinician, and educator, began his musical career in 7th grade playing alto saxophone in the Greenville Public Schools under the tutelage of his late father and renowned band director, Roy P. Huddleston. Jeff has received numerous superior accolades and awards including "All American" Hall of Fame Honor Band Award, United States Collegiate Wind Band Award, McDonald's All-American High School Band, Who's Who Among Outstanding Students Award. His plan after high school was to attend the college of his choice on a music scholarship.

Jeff Huddleston received his Bachelor of Music Degree from Mississippi Valley State University, Master of Music Composition from the University of Mississippi, and continued postgraduate studies in Jazz from the University of Memphis. At the collegiate levels, Jeff directed the Ole Miss "Collegiate" Jazz Band, the University of Memphis Jazz Ensemble II, and taught private saxophone lessons.

Jeff continued his 29-year music career with Memphis City Schools and Shelby County Schools as Director of Bands at Fairley High School and Director of Jazz Studies at Overton High School. His concert, marching, and jazz bands have performed throughout the country in regional and national festivals receiving "superior" ratings. His jazz bands were in great demand to perform at venues. Prior to Jeff's untimely death, the Overton Jazz Band received national recognition by placing second in the "Swing Central Jazz Festival" in Savannah Music Festival and received national and local recognition. Jeff was inducted into Amro Music Educator Walk of Fame and was a member of WTSBOA where he chaired numerous events including All-State Jazz Festivals. He was also a member of the International Association for Jazz Educators, Jazz Education Network, NAfME, Kappa Kappa Psi, Phi Mu Alpha, and Alpha Phi Alpha and was a "multiple year honoree" for the Who's Who Among American Teachers Award.

Jeff mentored numerous music education students and band directors. When not teaching in the classroom, Jeff's melodious saxophone could be heard with the New Hope Church of Memphis. Also he enjoyed, "Blue Bossa," a jazz combo group he founded that spans the parameters of the jazz idiom. Jeff also performed with The Temptations, The Four Tops, Bobby Rush, Chick Rogers, Free World, Joyce Cobb, and traveled with the Memphis All-Stars Band to perform in the Umbria Jazz Festival and Poretta Jazz Festival in Italy.

A native Memphian, Lanny Byrd's first musical experiences came from listening to the radio and performing on his make shift drum set. After beginning school at South Park Elementary, Mr. Byrd moved to Sherwood Junior High where he played on clarinet in Daryl Henning's band in grades 7-9.

In the fall of 1965 Lanny was a member of the woodwind class at Overton High School where he played bass clarinet under the direction of James Richens. He dropped out of band his junior and senior years at Overton and concentrated on playing drum set in numerous garage and club bands in the area.

While studying at Memphis State University, Lanny performed on drum set with many jazz and popular recording artists including B.J. Thomas, Marvin Stamm and Barry Manilow.

After graduating from Memphis State University in 1973, Lanny began his teaching career the following year by accepting the band director's position at Westwood High School in Memphis. In 1977, Lanny started the Skyview Academy Band Program Lanny and developed award-winning marching, concert and jazz ensembles.

Lanny then served as Director of Bands at Germantown High School from 1985 – 2015. His concert and marching bands received numerous superior ratings and awards throughout his tenure at Germantown HS. Additionally, many of Lanny's students annually earned positions in the All-West and All-State Bands. As the conductor for the Poplar Pike Playhouse Orchestra, Lanny conducted over 420 musical performances and the orchestra won numerous honors at the annual High School Musical Awards. Throughout his career, Lanny also served as a mentor for several of our current WTSBOA Band Directors. His legacy of dedicated service in instrumental music education is deeply embedded in the countless lives that have been influenced throughout his remarkable career.

Mr. Byrd retired from teaching in May 2015 and now spends a lot of quality time with his lovely wife Virginia. They met on a blind date and have been married for forty-one years. They have two daughters: Lanna, an ESL teacher at Knight Road Elementary and Sarah, who works in the advertising department at Comcast. Sarah and her husband Matt Tullos are the excited parents of the family's first grandchild Piper Leigh Tullos.

Throughout her 30-year service in music education, *Karen Bowman Henning* has taught at numerous West TN schools including Haywood County HS, Jackson Central Merry HS, and Liberty Technology Magnet HS. During her career, Karen's students consistently earned superior ratings and numerous awards at local and national concert festivals, and marching competitions including Chicago, Washington DC, New York, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi, Hawaii and Washington DC.

Karen has twice served as WTSBOA President and also on the Tennessee Music Educators Association Board. While WTSBOA President, the Wind Ensemble was formed as the top All-West senior high performing ensemble. She has served as the marching and Jackson site concert festival chair for the past 10 years. Throughout her career, Karen promoted unity in the school district she served by creating opportunities for the Jackson bands to perform together. She mentored and nurtured many novice and seasoned directors. She has served in numerous additional music education capacities including the WTSBOA Marching and Jackson Area Concert Festivals Chair, WTSBOA Jackson Area Solo and Ensemble Chair, All-State representative for WTSBOA, and All-State Band Rehearsal Chair for TMEA. She was also a charter member of Memphis Blues Brass Band Drum and Bugle Corp. Karen currently holds membership in Phi Beta Mu Band Director Fraternity, American School Band Director Association, and Tennessee Bandmaster Association.

Originally from Jackson, TN Karen credits Bill Watson, her high school band director, as being influential in her decision to become a music educator. She holds a Bachelor of Music Degree from Lambuth College and a Master of Music in Music Education from Austin Peay State University. She is currently an adjunct faculty member at Lane College where she teaches Music Appreciation and applied music classes. She also is the Data Coach and Testing Coordinator at Liberty Technology, High School, She is a member of the trustee hoard and vouth director at Mather Liberty CME Church, Karen and

nology High School. She is a member of the trustee board and youth director at Mother Liberty CME Church. Karen and James Henning have been married for 26 years and have four children, Matthew, Christopher, John, and Cynthia, and three grandchildren: Sophie, Braxton, and Jeremiah. She has served as a clinician and adjudicator in Tennessee, Arkansas, Kentucky, Illinois, and Mississippi. He is published in the Instrumentalist magazine (Jan. 2014 and Dec. 2015), an active clinician, and has travelled internationally working with music programs in South America (Chile) and with the LSU marching band in Dublin, Ireland. He is also an active drill designer for high school and university music programs across the country.

He holds degrees in Music from Jackson State University and Louisiana State University. He is a member of the College Band Directors National Association, Kappa Kappa Psi Fraternity Inc., National Association for Music Education, Louisiana Music Educators Association, Louisiana Association of Jazz Educators, HBCU Band Directors Consortium, and Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Inc.
