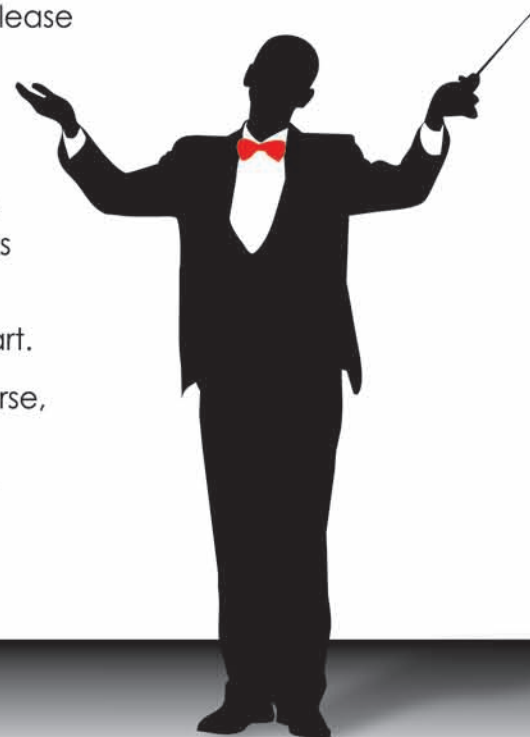

Melton Mustafa Jr. is a three Grammy Nominated Music Educator Quarterfinalist who was recently featured at The Jazz In The Gardens concert in Miami and is the son of International Jazz trumpeter and composer Melton S. Mustafa. Mustafa was born in Atlanta, GA. and raised in Miami, FL. where he started playing music in high school. Mr. Mustafa received a Bachelor of Science in Music Education from Florida A&M University. At FAMU, Mustafa performed with the FAMU "Strikers" at the Apollo theatre and traveled the world with the Marching "100". Mustafa received a Master's Degree in Education from Florida International University and is working on his Doctoral Degree in Leadership. Melton Mustafa currently works as Professional Music Educator at Parkway School of the Arts and is an Adjunct Professor at Florida Memorial University.

As a director, Mustafa has conducted the "Star Spangled Banner" for the Junior Olympics, written and directed a show for the Super Bowl entitled "Global Rhythms Local Beat", served as the Musical Director for the Show "From the Porch" featuring Danny Glover, directed the band and choreographed the featured Marching in Master "P" and Little Romeo's music video, "Two Way."

Melton has been featured on the following: More then Words - Mr. Sax "Butterfly", "St. Louis Blues", "Sea B Marrah", Betty Pageant, Ike and Val Woods Live at Tobacco Road, Pieces of a Pisces, Jesus was a Capricorn, Guest Artist for the show "By Kids for Kids", acted in The Language of Music -Tom Dowd, acted in "The Buddy Holly Story" Actor's Play House", danced at the Apollo Theater.

As a producer, Melton Mustafa just released "Scenes from Miami" Vol. 1 "The Softer Side" and his latest production "The Traveling Man" features his dad Melton Mustafa senior, the late Mulgrew Miller, Victor Lewis, Patrick Bartley and Essiet Essiet. Melton Mustafa is currently working on adapting his original music "Shalom Salaam Serene" into an audio book to be used in the public school system.



Dr. Jack Cooper is Associate Professor and Jazz and Commercial Music Area Coordinator at the University of Memphis Scheidt School of Music (B.A., M.A., Cal. State U Los Angeles; D.M.A., Univ. of Texas, Austin), and is musical director and founder of the Mid South based Jazz Orchestra of the Delta. Their CD, "Big Band Reflections of Cole Porter" (Summit Records) was released in 2003 to international acclaim. He and the JOD collaborated with award winning choreographer Mark Godden to produce the ballet "Two Jubilees" which was premiered in February 2006.

Dr. Cooper is also the musical director for the 2015 "Time Within Itself" release for Origin Records. The CD garnered international acclaim. Polish jazz critic Andrzej Fikus writes, "Time Within Itself owes its success largely to excellent arrangements by Jack Cooper, one of today's best jazz arrangers in the U.S. ... (sic) particularly in the layer of instrumentation. Cooper gives a masterful display here." The second release for Origin Records is in late 2017. Most recently, he is serving as the Composer and Arranging in Residence for the Berlin Jazz Orchestra and also the Young Voices of Brandenburg.

As a saxophonist and woodwind specialist he has worked with many artists including Macey Gray, Brian McKnight, Manhattan Transfer, the Temptations, Glenn Campbell and many others. His television and media music writing credits include the The Jenny Jones Show, Danish Radio 2 (DR P2), E! Entertainment shows, Access Hollywood, American Restoration, Deal or No Deal and Extra. He can be heard on numerous releases, to include for Select O Hits and SkyDeck Records. He also toured in the sax section of the U.S. Army Jazz Knights (1989-95) and served as their staff arranger. Dr. Cooper has also been featured in numerous venues around the world including the North Sea Montreux Jazz Festivals.

Nationally he is widely known as a jazz educator and clinician through conducting many All-State groups and clinics in Tennessee, Arkansas, Arizona, Texas, South Carolina, North Carolina, California, Nevada, Florida, Missouri, Iowa Illinois and others.

Dr. Ammerman has been named the Virginia Orchestra Director of the Year in 2016, has been a finalist for the Fairfax County Public Schools' Teacher of the Year, Washington Post Teacher of the Year, and UT Martin's Advisor of the Year (2018), and was recognized as FCPS' Top Teacher in 2017. Ammerman recently completed a chapter for the upcoming book: Rehearsing the Middle School Orchestra compiled by Sandie Barnes Goldie, and is hard at work on what she hopes to be her next publication: The Hook Book: Mindset Mapping from Minute 1.

Ammerman is a passionate and dedicated music education professor and music educator and is in high demand as a guest conductor, speaker, and clinician for sessions and workshops at local, state, national, and international conferences and in-services. Her research has been published in Teaching Music, American String Teachers Journal, Stringendo Publication, and the Fingerboard Publication. Dr. Ammerman is known for an emphasis on play-based learning, humor, a unique style, and for the creation of the first ever Future Music Educators Camp as well as her Music Education Podcast: #MusicEdLove.

Ms. Woo's most recent international guest conducting appearance was with the 2018 State Honours Ensemble Program at the Queensland Conservatorium (Griffith University) in Brisbane, Australia.

Ms. Woo enjoys an active schedule as an international guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator with numerous honor groups, conducting symposia, and music festivals. Additionally, she provides professional development for school districts and universities sharing her experiences with Band, Orchestra, Choir and Jazz Ensembles.

Ms. Woo was recognized by the Santa Monica Rotary Club as the 2005 Santa Monica-Malibu District Teacher of the Year. She was honored at the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic as a 2012 Legion of Honor Laureate by the John Philip Sousa National Foundation.



Andrew Crust is in his second season as Assistant Conductor of the Memphis Symphony Orchestra, and serves as conductor of the Memphis Youth Symphony. Mr. Crust's recent conducting positions include Cover Conductor of the Kansas City Symphony and Nashville Symphony, Assistant/Cover Conductor of the Boulder Philharmonic, Music Director of the CU-Boulder Campus Orchestra, and Assistant Conductor of Opera McGill. Mr. Crust was selected as Assistant Conductor for the Carnegie Hall Weill Institute's National Youth Orchestra of the USA in 2017. As a winner of the 2018 Ansbacher Fellowship, Mr. Crust attended the Salzburger Festspiele throughout August 2018. Mr. Crust was the only American invited as a semi-finalist for the 2018 Nestlé and Salzburg Festival's Young Conductors Award and conducted the Austrian Ensemble for New Music. He also attended at the Salzburg Festival, winning the Ansbacher Fellowship of the American Austrian Foundation.

Mr. Crust's recent guest engagements include concerts with the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, Hartford Symphony, Lima Symphony, l'Orchestre de la Francophonie in Québec, the Boulder Opera Company, the Colorado New Music Ensemble, the Pendulum New Music Series, and the Colorado College Summer Music Festival. Abroad, he has led concerts with the Orchestra Giovanile Italiana in Italy, Hamburger Symphoniker at the Mendelssohn Festival in Germany, the Moravian Philharmonic in the Czech Republic, the Filharmonia "Mihail Jora" of Bacau, Romania, and the Orquesta Sinfonica de Chile in Santiago. In 2017 he was awarded first prize at the Accademia Chigiana by Daniel Gatti, to guest conduct the Orchestra di Sanremo in Italy.

In 2016, he was selected to audition for Riccardo Muti and Renata Scotto for Muti's Italian Opera Academy in Ravenna. He completed his doctorate at the University of Colorado Boulder in 2016 with academic emphasis on Brahms performance practice.

James Melvin "Jimmie" Lunceford

(JUNE 6, 1902 – JULY 12, 1947)

Jimmie Lunceford was born on a farm near Fulton, Mississippi. Seven months after James Melvin was born, the family moved to Oklahoma City and then to Denver where Lunceford went to high school and studied music under Wilberforce J. Whiteman, father of Paul Whiteman, whose band was soon to acquire a national reputation. There Lunceford learned several instruments in the band and continued his studies at Fisk University in Nashville. At the age of 20 he was playing alto saxophone in local bands throughout Tennessee.

In 1927, Lunceford was hired to teach English and Spanish and coach the Manassas football and baseball teams. The school had no budget for music, no instruments, no music curriculum, and no idea what music education could do for a community. Jimmie Lunceford found many capable student musicians and brought together a group of young men, motivated them, and equipped them with the help of community donors. One of his students recalled that "he was a good

disciplinarian, a good teacher, and the students just had a fit over him. Lunceford played sophisticated jazz."

The group developed into a Jazz Orchestra style band, and Lunceford named it the Chickasaw Syncopators. Some would claim the group to be the "First Memphis City School Orchestra." Lunceford's eleven-piece high school jazz band included musicians who sang and doubled on different instruments. The Lunceford sound distinguished itself in a crowded field of talented swing bands with its two-beat syncopation, a sonic ancestor of what came to be known as "The Memphis Sound" heard in the 1960s and 1970s.

In 1929, the Manassas High School Band began its professional career, and the band changed its name to the Jimmie Lunceford Orchestra. Those students who graduated that year went with him when Lunceford left Manassas in 1930 to make their first recordings and begin touring. In 1934 the band accepted a booking at the famed Harlem nightclub The Cotton Club. With their tight musicianship and the often-outrageous humor in their music and lyrics, Lunceford's orchestra made an ideal band for the club, and Lunceford's reputation began to steadily grow. By the mid-1930s, Jimmie Lunceford was considered the equal of Duke Ellington and Count Basie.

Lunceford died young at the age of 45 after he collapsed during an autograph session at a record store in Seaside, Oregon from a heart attack and was buried at Elmwood Cemetery in Memphis. Lunceford has the distinction of being the first jazz educator in the public-school system. Lunceford's success helped begin the tradition of Manassas as Memphis' jazz high school. Most of the top Memphis jazz musicians for the next 50 years came out of that school, including trumpeter Booker Little, pianist Harold Mabern, saxophonist Frank Stozier and Black Moses himself, Isaac Hayes.

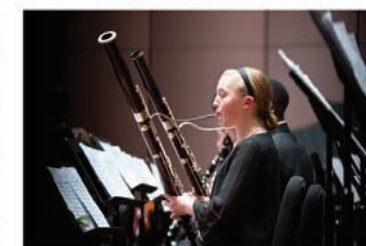

Karen is a member of American School Band Director Association, Phi Beta Mu Music Fraternity, NfAME, TMEA, and WTSBOA where she served as president for two terms.



Dr. John Oelrich joined the faculty of The University of Tennessee at Martin (UTM) Department of Music in 2012 as Director of Bands where he conducts the Wind Ensemble and teaches courses in conducting and music education.

His recent engagements as a guest conductor include the Gateway Music Association Honor Band, Kentucky All-District #1 Middle School Honor Band, Tennessee Mid-State 9-10 Gold Band, Tennessee All-West Middle School Blue Band, Pennsylvania Music Educators Association All-State Concert Band, and is scheduled to conduct the Wisconsin State Honors Band in 2019.

In the summer of 2013, he founded the Martin Community Band which performs several concerts each summer. He also leads the jazz band for, the After-School Arts Program, an arts-centered program for the county's middle school students.

Prior to UT-Martin, John was the Doctoral Conducting Associate at The Ohio State University and taught at Loras College in Dubuque, Iowa for several years, including one year as Interim Director of Instrumental Music. Prior to Loras, Oelrich spent ten years teaching middle school and high school band in Iowa and Wisconsin.

After growing up on a dairy farm near Spencer, Wisconsin, John earned his Bachelor of Science in Instrumental and Vocal Music Education from the University of Wisconsin - Platteville, a Master of Music from the University of Northern Iowa and a Doctor of Musical Arts in Conducting from The Ohio State University. When not involved in music or teaching related activities, John enjoys spending time with his family, hiking, motorcycling and amateur astronomy.

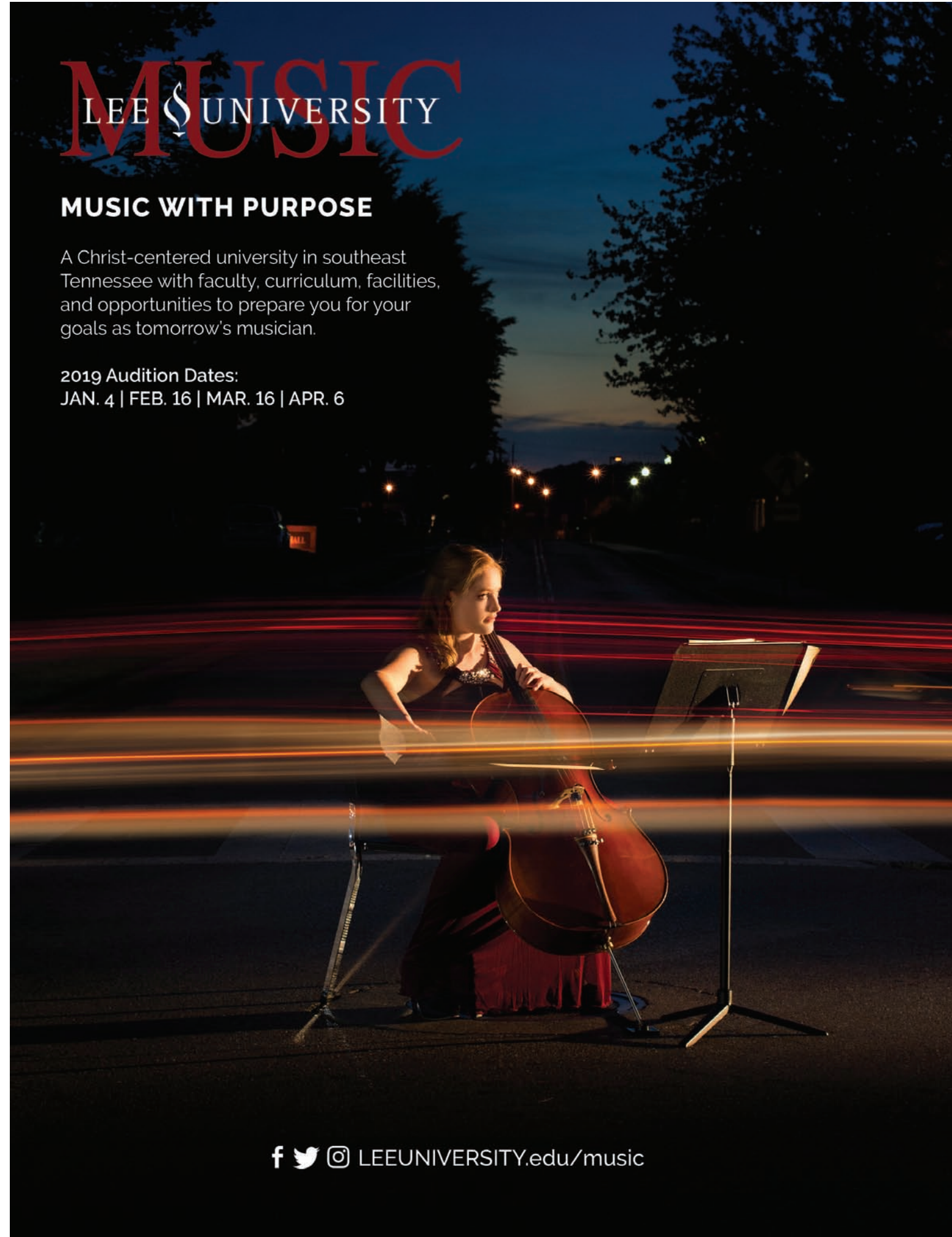

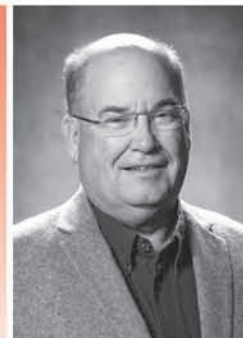

Randal Box retired as Director of Bands at Brentwood High School in Brentwood, Tennessee in May of 2018 after holding that position since 1991. He is now Director of Bands at West Memphis High School and Supervisor of Bands for the West Memphis School District. Mr. Box also taught in Pocahontas, Arkansas, and Clarksville, and holds degrees from Middle Tennessee State University and Arkansas State University.

The Brentwood Band performed in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade, the Fiesta Bowl National Band Championship, and appeared in the Waikiki Hui Ana of Bands parade in Honolulu, in commemoration of the 75th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. The Brentwood Band has been a finalist 10 times in the MTSU Contest of Champions and was named Reserve Grand Champion in 2002, and has been a finalist numerous times in Bands of America regionals, as well as being named a Grand Nationals Semifinalist on four occasions.

Mr. Box is a past-president of the Middle Tennessee School Band & Orchestra Association and Immediate Past-President of the Tennessee Bandmasters Association. He is the recipient of both the Certificate of Merit and the Citation of Excellence from the National Band Association, was featured in the cover article of the July 2008 Instrumentalist magazine, and in 2011 was named a "John Philip Sousa Foundation Legion of Honor Laureate." In April of 2013 Mr. Box was inducted into the MTSU Band of Blue Hall of Fame.

Mr. Box and his wife Tawana, also a notable music educator having placed numerous studio flute students in all-region and all-state bands for over 30 years, have four children. All four as well as one son-in-law teach music in the public schools of Tennessee.



Albert Nguyen is the Director of Bands at the University of Memphis. His responsibilities include overseeing all aspects of the university bands, conducting the Wind Ensemble, leading the graduate wind conducting program, and serving as the director of the University of Memphis Music Camp. He also teaches undergraduate and graduate courses in music education. Prior to this position, Dr. Nguyen served as the Assistant Director of Bands and the Director of Athletic Bands at the University of Memphis. He began his professional teaching career in Arkansas as the Director of Bands at Morrilton High School and maintains his connection to the public schools by frequently serving as an adjudicator, clinician, and guest conductor throughout the country.

Dr. Nguyen holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Music Education from Arkansas Tech University and the Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts in Wind Conducting from The University of Texas at Austin. He is a member of Kappa Kappa Psi, Tau Beta Sigma, College Band Directors National Association, National Association for Music Educators, and is a contributing author in the GIA publication *Teaching Music through Performance in Band*.

He is also a member of Phi Beta Mu band director's fraternity. In addition to teaching, Keith is also a sought-after adjudicator for both marching and concert festivals in both Tennessee and Virginia. Elva Kaye Lance is Director of Bands at Mississippi State University.
